

A word that describes a noun.

Examples: monstrous, vivid,
delightful, familiar

Answer: adjective

A name of a person or a place.

Examples: Daniel, Hilton, London,
Spain

Answer: proper noun

A name of an object or thing.

Examples: table, pencil, house, car,
coat, kettle

Answer: common noun

A name of a group.

Examples: crowd, flock, team

Answer: collective noun

**A name of a quality, concept or
idea.**

Examples: courage, freedom, love

Answer: abstract noun

**An action or doing word (which
can be present, past or future)**

Examples: trudged, is/was/were,
walk, singing.

Answer: verb

A word that modifies a verb, adjective or another adverb that describes manner, time and place.

Examples: anxiously, soon, very,
tomorrow

Answer: adverb

A word that joins clauses

Examples: and, so, but, because,
although

Answer: conjunction

A word that shows time, location or position.

Examples: above, among, from,
near, under, behind

Answer: preposition

A word used to introduce a noun to specify which one or how many.

Examples: an/a, the, two, most,
some

Answer: determiner

A word used in place of a noun.

Examples: it, she, he, we, they, our

Answer: pronoun
